

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS



STOP DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

WHEN A DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASE IS REPORTED AT ANY POLICE STATION

The VICTIM should:

1. Be treated with respect and dignity.
2. Be interviewed in an isolated Victim Friendly Room.
3. Be attended by a female police officer if you are a woman.

The POLICE should:

- > Promptly respond by going to the scene where a case of domestic violence is reported.
- > Assist the victim to get the medical assistance / shelter.
- > Arrest the perpetrator and confiscate the firearm or any dangerous weapon.
- > Inform the Perpetrator about the protection order.
- > Record the case on the Domestic Violence Register.

Over and above this, The Minister of Police recently pronounced that there should be a fully resourced desk in all police stations dealing with GBV.
